

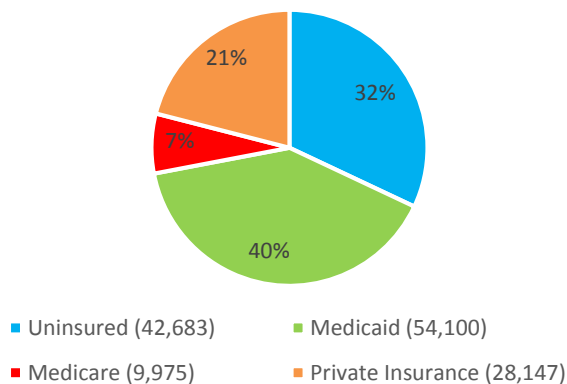


Rhode Island's nine **community health centers**, including 8 federally qualified health centers (FQHCs), serve Rhode Islanders at 29 office locations throughout the state. The community health centers have a long history of providing high-quality, low-cost primary health care to Rhode Islanders. Community health centers are non-profit, safety-net primary care providers that serve patient populations who otherwise confront financial, geographic, language, and cultural barriers accessing health care services.

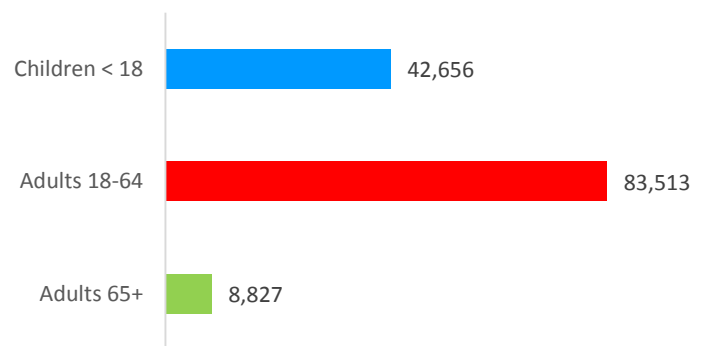
Community Health Center Fact Sheet - 2012

In 2012, community health centers served **134,905** patients in Rhode Island and provided **564,446** patient visits, about 12,000 more patients and 44,000 more visits than in 2011. The community health centers continue to expand access to medical, dental and behavioral health services for all their patients, whether they have public or private insurance or are uninsured. Uninsured patients pay for their health care on a sliding scale, based on their income. In 2012, the community health centers provided \$17.4 million in discounted and free services to patients.

Rhode Island's community health centers are also small businesses. They all contribute to the local economy through employment and purchases.

Rhode Island's community health centers employ **146 medical and dental providers** (doctors, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurse midwives and dentists).*

Rhode Island's community health centers employ **nearly 1,000 staff members**, including providers, medical assistants, case managers, dental hygienists and other staff necessary to serve our 134,905 patients.*

*Staff numbers are for full-time-equivalents, or FTEs; actual number of people employed is higher, as staff members may be part-time.

Rhode Island's community health centers are leading the way....

...in integrating medical and behavioral health care

The community health centers recognize the importance of integrating behavioral health services with primary care to best serve individuals and families. In 2012, our community health centers continued to invest in behavioral health services, serving 16% more patients than in 2011.

...in integrating medical and dental care.

In 2012, the community health centers treated 45,715 adults and children with over 125,400 dental visits. There are 83 dental operatories at 15 community health center dental locations. Community health centers also offer dental care to children through school-based programs and the Molar Express van, and to nursing home residents through other mobile dentistry programs.

...in Electronic Health Records

All of Rhode Island's federally qualified community health centers use electronic medical records. Electronic medical records improve efficiency and clinical outcomes, aid in quality improvement and streamline resource management.

...in Patient-Centered Medical Homes

Community health centers, with their long-standing goal of providing integrated primary medical, behavioral health and dental care for their patients, fit naturally into the patient-centered medical home (PCMH) model of care that is being promoted nationally and locally. The medical home is a model in which care is coordinated across the health care system and assures patients get care when and where they want it, in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner. The Rhode Island Health Center Association provides the community health centers with resources and expertise in medical home development, practice redesign and the review process to assist them in moving to national PCMH recognition.
